This half term our CLJ topic will be Fire, Fire! The children will be learning about the Great Fire of London, baking bread and visiting the Museum of London.

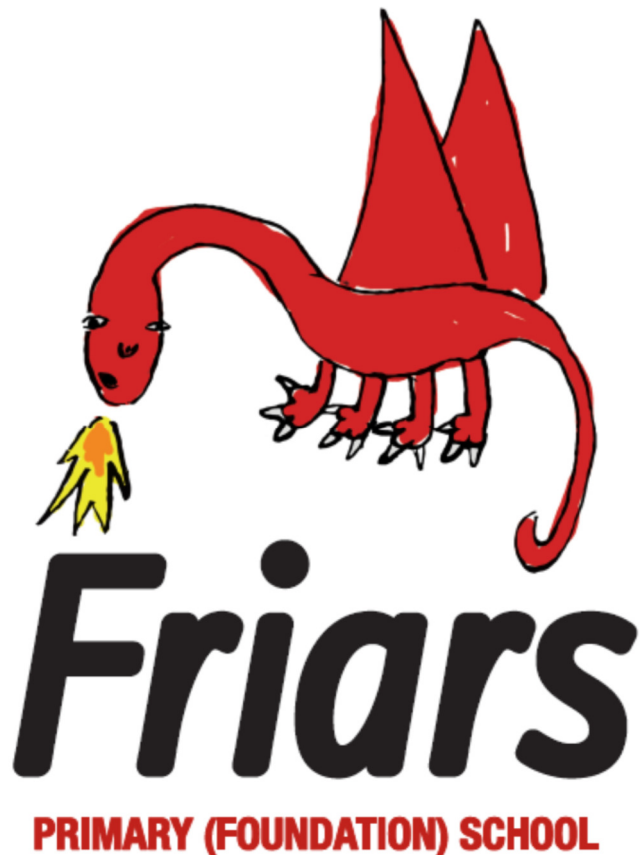


PE
