"Peas corp" event:

Everyone at the school – children, teachers, and parents – can expect a really extraordinary spectacle on Friday afternoon (30th September) at 3pm. An outdoor performance company called The Bureau of Silly Ideas (BOSI) will be bringing an unusual "foot patrol" with "air support" to the school along with its clowning 'Peas Corps' as part of Southwark Council's Blackfriars Stories series of events. 100 years ago during the First World War a German Zeppelin airship was shot down in flames over Blackfriars Bridge on 1st October 1916 – this event is a way of commemorating that event that turns it around from tragedy to gentle comedy without belittling the original historical event. The children have been preparing for the arrival of the 'Peas Corps' with an artist this week making banners and bunting to welcome the BOSI team and we hope that everyone will want to come and see this special visit to the school of the Bureau of Silly Ideas' wild and wonderful inventions. 
Harvest:
