Dear Parents

KS2 SATs:

Year 6 have shown determination, resilience, good humour and real commitment this week during their SATs. They all deserve to do as well as they can. Thankyou to all the parents who have supported their children so well and thankyou to all the staff who have worked so hard on their behalf, especially Miss Gethin Jones, the Year 6 teacher.

Attendance:

Our attendance needs to improve! Whilst we understand children do fall ill our attendance expectation is now 97%. This is just above the national average of 95.8% (you will see that only 3 classes this week have an average above 97%) School attendance is vital for the life long success of our children. At the end of each half term we will be meeting with parents of some children whose attendance has gone below 90%. In addition to the class attendance award we give every week we will, from now on, once a half term, give special badges to individual children with attendance over 97% and an even more special badge for children with 100%. Children at the end of the year who have 100% attendance for the whole year will be entered into a raffle for a special prize. Finally, any unauthorised requests for holidays during term time will be automatically referred to Southwark Council who will decide whether to issue a penalty notice. The table below explains how attendance affects learning:

100% attendance	0 lessons missed	Best chance of success – Outstanding!
95% attendance	50 lessons missed	Good chance of learning – Well done!
90% attendance	100 lessons missed	Poor attendance – we are worried
85% attendance	150 lessons missed	Poor attendance – we are very worried
80% attendance	200 lessons missed	Poor attendance – we are seriously concerned

Gentle reminders:

Can parents remember to ensure that all children have correct PE kit to change into on the relevant days. This does not include football tops or shirts with logos on. Our PE kit consists of navy or black, non baggy shorts or plain sports trousers and a white t-shirt. Football shirts, logos or overly patterned clothing are not permitted. "Be Fit Be Fun Be Friars" t-shirts are available from the school office at the subsidised cost of £3.

A small minority of children have been eating sweets and chewing gum at playtimes and sometimes in class. Please note that sweets or chewing gum are not allowed in school at any point in the day (this includes at breakfast club and after school clubs) and will be confiscated and thrown away if we find children with them.
