#### School closure

Public Health England have decided that our school needs to close until further notice to try and delay the spread of COVID -19.

We would like Friars children to continue with their learning at home, so we are providing parents with work to be completed at home. The majority of these can be accessed online. All the relevant passwords will be put on inside the front cover of your child's homework book. They can use this book to complete a range of activities. They also have a copy of their curriculum for this term – Spring 2. When accessing online resources try and look for activities that relate to the curriculum information on our website.

# **English**

- Reading: Children will be bringing home books from their class libraries. They Accelerated Reader passwords are in

  day and if you are able to share books between friends and family please do so. We would like children to write book
  reviews of the books they have read and there are sample book review templates on the Twinkl website.
- Phonics: <a href="https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/">https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/</a> is a site which has several free interactive phonics games, ideas and resources.
- Writing: Children can keep a daily journal/diary in their homework books. They can write about what they have done each day, how they feel etc. They can also use the books to write and create stories, poems, reports and other types of writing.
- Spelling: We have just subscribed to a new website called Spelling frame: <a href="https://spellingframe.co.uk/">https://spellingframe.co.uk/</a>. Some children will have used this in school. There are many spelling games. Just click on the correct Year Group and children can choose a game to practise any of the spelling rules for their year group.











### History/Geography/Science/Art/Computing:

Each class will be given a question to explore or specific activities that refer to current or future learning. They are posted on the class pages on our school's website. Children could create a power point, build a model, create a boardgame, draw a picture, write a report etc. to show their findings in a format that they choose.
