Packed lunches and party bags:

We are currently working on a new whole school food policy and we will be sharing it with parents and children after half term. It will reflect our commitment to ensuring that children eat healthily and have a nutritionally bal-

anced diet. The policy will also renew our expectations about the contents of packed lunches too. Some parents have also asked us about giving out party bags when it is their children's birthday. It has long been established here that staff do not give out party bags and it is for the parents to hand them out. Unfortunately because of the current end of day arrangements we are asking that parents do not give out party bags as it would not be covid safe. We are thinking of ways in which children's birthdays can be recognized on the actual day, however.

Black History Month:

This year each year group are taking a different category of significant figures from Black History including Musicians, Artists, Sports people, politicians, writers, scientists and pioneers. They are doing a stand alone class based research project on people from Black History that represent the different areas.

There will be a range of outcomes such as writing, poetry, art, performance, and video done individually, in pairs, groups and as a whole class We will create a page on the website and put all the work up on it for parents to see by the end of this half term.

Also on Wednesday 14th October, Year 3 and Year 4 will work with a local artist Xavier Leopold and motivational speaker Karl Konadu. The 'I can' creative and educational workshop, will use the arts (drawing/painting and storytelling) to teach the children about individuals in black history who were faced with unbelievable obstacles but went on to be great. Each class will produce their own paintings. All members of the workshop team will comply with our Covid-19 safety protocols. Beyond the Event, a selection of the paintings will be put on display at the Xavi Art Exhibition at the Oxo Tower. WE will be donating the workshop fee to Black Minds Matter UK (BMM UK) for the advancement of their mission.




