Creativity in action at Friars!

As we let you know in last week's newsletter, our focus value this half term is creativity. It has been wonderful to see some of the pre pandemic Friars type activities returning to the school that promote the value of creativity in action this week.

Year 5 enjoyed their contribution to the Young voices concert. In the past we have been part of a live massed choir at the O2 in Greenwich. This year, sadly, it was a virtual choir and the concert happened in the classroom. That said it was a joy to hear Year 5 singing throughout the school and expressing their musical creativity.

The Early Years and KS1 took part in drama activities on Tuesday with a company called "Perform". The workshops had an under water adventure theme. The children cast off their shells and dived into

a thrilling underwater adventure filled with magical sea creatures. They danced like dolphins, sang like starfish and twirled like turtles. The workshops were fun and energetic and aimed at building confidence, enhancing coordination, boosting concentration and developing communication and of course, creativity.

Our **art project in the new building** is coming on a pace. Mrs Wignall has taken all of the children's ideas and has used them to create a mural that celebrates our values. She has also worked with groups of children to produce beautiful delicate clay tiles that represent nature and will hang in the art/dt/science studio. Next week she will be working on a cd weaving piece that will be proudly displayed in the performing arts studio.



Children's learning at Friars:

Year 5 have been developing their creativity even further in their art unit this half term which is all about multi media collages. They are learning to arrange mixed media in order to create an image as well as developing composition skills and changing work as they go along.

So far they have created a simplified image of a map of the school using paper and fabric. They will use this plan to help create a quilted map using fabric and wool maps made of block colour squares. While we are on the subject of works in progress (see above Y5 art work), please have a look at how our mural is coming on and some of the beautiful delicate clay tiles that have been made.










Attendance:
