# This year the staff at Friars have continued to develop and improve the curriculum and welfare that we offer your children and reflecting our motto of "achieving excellence in a happy, nurturing and safe environment."

In the Autumn Term, we said farewell to the Bridges Federation after a year in a soft federation with them. They brought new ideas and helped us think about the ways forward for Friars. We were involved in exciting projects with the Unicorn Theatre, and classes enjoyed a wide variety of curriculum based trips and visits. We were so pleased to be able to invite our parents in and perform the Christmas productions face to face again.

In the Spring Term, we opened our new library and children have enjoyed borrowing books and working in small groups in that relaxing environment. Our wellbeing week was amazing especially sports day and all the support from parents and the community. All children have been out on at least one visit linked to their curriculum. We have been so proud of all our pupils who have shown such determination and resilience. They won an award at the PE & Sports Network Annual celebration, with Sarah winning P.E. teacher of the year too. Year 6 and 5 enjoyed a wonderful week at Wick Court being farmers with such an interesting range of activities to keep them busy. Year R, 1 and 2 visited Littlehampton and had a day enjoying the beach. We had some wonderful events where parents, staff and pupils came together for a summer fair and dance performance. #### **Attendance and Punctuality**

Our whole school attendance for the academic year 22-23 has been lower than we would like and lower than national averages for 21-22. We have fallen short of our 96% target with our whole school attendance for the year reaching only 92%. Leave during term time is **not** authorised and must only be taken during exceptional circumstances. From September 2022 new statutory guidance came into force to monitor school attendance. Concerns about persistent absence or lateness <u>will</u> be referred to the Education Inclusion Team or Family Early Help Service. Fines <u>will</u> be issued for term time leave.

Arriving at school on time and attending school regularly is essential for children's well being and progress in school. This will always be one of our school priorities. Our gates open at 8.45am and lessons start at 9.00am so children must be in school, ready to learn, by this time.

Children earn points for their class towards a weekly attendance cup and clock for good attendance and punctuality. Each half term children can work towards a different coloured wristband for 100% attendance and punctuality, with a gold badge for those who manage 100% for the whole academic year






In History we went to visit the Southwark Heritage Centre to find out Southwark's local History

In D&T, we build bridges and tested out their strength.








We went on a Geography field trip to Richmond. Remember running up that hill!






We planted flowers and decorated a planter for a competition.


