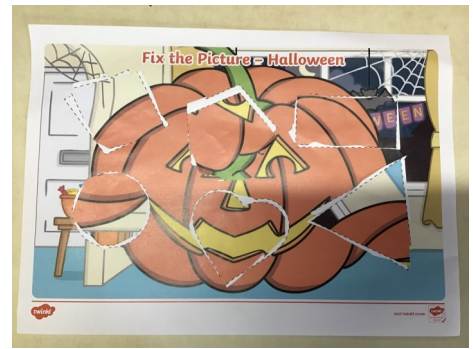
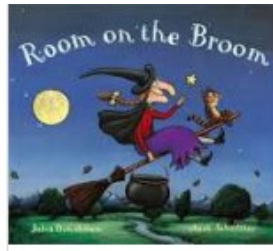
Overall whole school attendance for week beginning 30/10/2023 is 92.01%

1st Place Attendance: Year 4

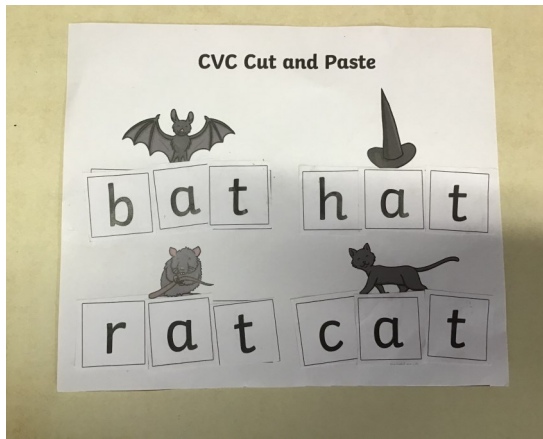
1st Place Punctuality: Year 6

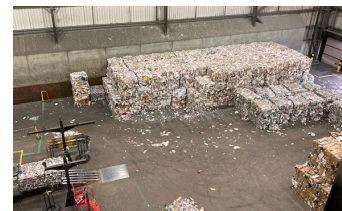
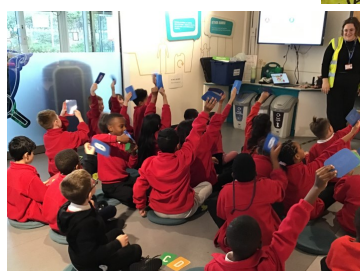
We read 'Room on the Broom.' We used our phonics knowledge to spell some of the words from the story. We also explored different pumpkins.
