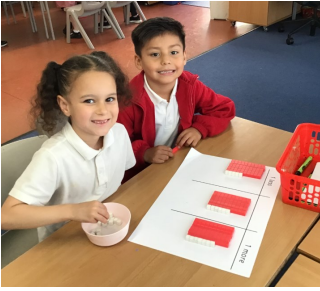

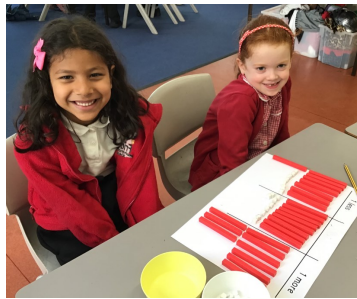
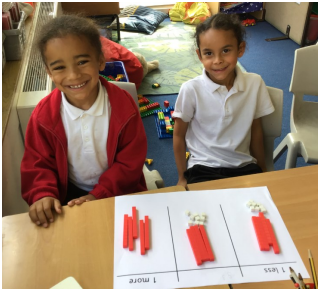
1st Place Attendance: Year 1

In Maths, Year 1 have been busy consolidating their understanding of Place Value up to 100. They used Base 10 to find 1 more and 1 less than a given number.



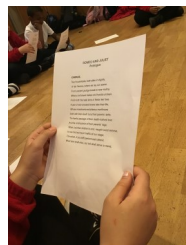
